- Respect the advice that you receive
- Treat others as you would wish to be treated yourself

- Look out for yourself and for the welfare of others
- Speak out (to your parents or a club representative) if you consider that you or others have been poorly treated
- Be organised and on time
- Tell someone in authority if you are leaving the venue
- Accept that these guidelines are in place for the well-being of all concerned
- Treat organisers and coaches with respect
- Observe instructions or restrictions requested by the adults looking after you
- I will respect the property and contents within the Junior Room, leaving it clean and tidy.
- I appreciate that only junior members of Louth Golf Club can visit/use the Common Room and will not
  invite anyone else to use it.

You should not take part in any irresponsible, abusive, inappropriate or illegal behaviour which includes:
